DESCRIPTION:

Modern controversies have arisen over ancient scriptural documents. They range from questions over biblical fundamentalism to the controversial views promoted by the "Jesus Seminar." This course will examine the notion of controversy both "within" and "about" the Bible. Questions of controversy concerning the creation stories, the history of Israel, the life and actions of Jesus the Jew, the writings of Paul, the Book of Revelation and the historical and contemporary use and abuse of the Bible will be examined in detail.

OBJECTIVE:

- 1. To study the biblical world in a way that allows the element of controversy to emerge with all the challenges this type of study presents.
- 2. To specifically study a multitude of controversial texts, events, individuals, messages, interpretations of and approaches toward scripture that excite and alarm both believers and non-believers.
- 3. To encourage critical use of biblical material utilizing contemporary biblical scholarship including historical, scientific, linguistic and theological tools.
- 4. To lead students beyond basic facts to a deeper understanding of biblical facts and persons as revealed through the bible.

REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Presence and active participation in all scheduled class meetings.
- 2. Completion of all assignments, quizzes and exam.

GRADING:

30% class participation and attendance

30% quizzes (10% each quiz)

15% final examination

25% course paper/presentation (5 page paper typed, double spaced and presented in class during the final week of class. Topic must be pre-approved by instructor).

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- 1. Knowledge of the subject matter from textbook, class lectures and discussion, and independent research.
- 2. Ability to apply above knowledge to current biblical scholarship.
- 3. Ability to understand (but not necessarily agree with) subject matter from different viewpoints and/or beliefs.
