COURSE DESCRIPTION:

We will be engaged in dialogue this semester concerning Christian and non-Christian traditions of human dignity and social justice. Special emphasis will be placed on liberation from oppressive social structures.

REQUIRED TEXTS:

Boff and Boff, *Introduction to Liberation Theology*

Additional reading will be placed on library reserve including selections from:

- Matthew Fox's *Coming of the Cosmic Christ*
- Documents of the Catholic Church relating to such issues as economic and political justice, the impact of capitalism on human dignity, global human rights, and other contemporary issues.

Students will also need to have access to a Bible throughout the semester and will occasionally be required to bring it to class.

ORGANIZATION OF THE COURSE AND GRADES:

This course will attempt to integrate lectures and small group discussions. Final grades will be determined as follows:

- three--four exams (approximately 70%)
- two or three take home assignments (approximately 30%)

PLEASE NOTE: It is expected that students be present on the days that exams are administered and that all assignments be submitted on time. Students are not automatically entitled to makeup exams or to other extensions. It is always up to the discretion of the instructor to determine if and when makeups are given or if any other form of extension is merited and with what grade penalty.

Regular attendance is expected in this course. Students who accumulate more than three (unexcused) absences will begin to have points deducted from their final grade according to the discretion of the instructor.

I invite students to make an appointment to see me during the semester. The purpose is simply this: I do not enjoy teaching a class of strangers.
