INTRODUCTION AND DESCRIPTION:

Spanish 101 is an elementary introduction to the Spanish language and culture. As such this course will survey basic aspects of grammar structure, and expressions of daily and standard usage throughout the Spanish-speaking world.

The purpose of this course is to give students a solid foundation which will enable them to advance successfully to the next learning stages.

Students will learn both the functional communicative speech patterns from Spain and South America and, the standard approach to writing which tends to erase the differences of daily speech and colloquial usage. Reading and listening activities are integrated to give students the necessary skills for simple but effective communication in all the main areas of language: speaking; writing; listening; reading.

REQUIREMENTS:

Attendance and participation are crucial to obtain a solid second language foundation. Students are expected to develop and maintain a practical level of skills to actively participate in pair or group exercises. The textbook will be used daily; consequently, students are required to bring it to every class.

Workbook, home study: As recommended by linguists, two hours of out-ofclass study time are expected for each lecture of 50 min.
