**Course objectives**

To develop a basic competency in speaking, listening, writing and reading; to gain a knowledge base of Hispanic culture and geography. We will cover chapter 5 through chapter 8 of the textbook. Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to talk: about weather and seasons and the different activities they do depending on the weather; food preferences; about mealtimes in the Spanish-speaking world; about trips and traveling; discuss likes and dislikes more fully; talk about vacations and interesting places to visit in the Spanish-speaking world; about holidays and other important dates of the year and how they feel in certain situations. Also students will be able to make comparison between the verbs SER and ESTAR; make formal commands and requests; express negation and use negative words; talk about things that happened in the past; express in a sentence direct and indirect objects separately and together

**Quiz/Chapter Exams/Final Exam**

The quiz, chapter exams, and the final exam need to be taken on the day indicated in the syllabus or stipulated by the instructor. Everything covered in class may be tested. **In case of emergency, please contact your instructor before the test day. Otherwise.**

**No make-ups will be given. Written proof of your emergency is required.**

**...If you are unable to attend class on a testing day...**

You will only be allowed to make up any quizzes, chapter tests or the final exam if you can proof a medical emergency or that your employer needed you at work. In both instances, you will be required to do the following before you will be allowed to make up any quizzes, tests or the final exam:

1. Call your instructor within 24 hours of the testing date stating the reason why you will be *unable to attend class*. If you are unable to call, have somebody else call for you.
2. Provide the instructor with original written paperwork documenting the medical emergency or work obligation you had upon returning to the next class meeting, but no later than two class meetings after the testing day in question. Supply an original statement from your doctor including his/her name, address, telephone number, and signature. It needs to be stated that you were unable to attend class on the day in question, not simply that you were under his/her care.

If you had to work: supply an original statement from your commander if you are in the military including his/her *name*, address, telephone number, and signature. It needs to be stated that you had duty on the day and time in question. If you are not in the military provide an original statement from your boss including his/her name, title, company name, address, phone number and signature. It needs to be stated that you had to work on the day and time in question.

3. To avoid point deduction as laid forth in the syllabus, you will be required to turn in your homework that was due on the testing day at the following class meeting.
4. Do not ask me to make an exception for you.

#### **Homework**

The homework (e.g. workbook, lab manual, short compositions, handouts etc.) may vary in points and are due on the day indicated by your instructor. Some in class activities (i.e. group work) may be graded as well. **Your homework assignments will be accepted only one class period late, however will be subjected to a 25% point deduction from the maximum points available for the particular assignment.** Both homework and in-class assignments will be counted together for the maximum points available and will be averaged if the maximum points are not reached by the end of the semester.

#### **Preparation / participation**

Classes will be conducted primarily in Spanish so that you may process a maximum, amount of the target language either mentally or otherwise. Please **DO NOT be afraid** to make mistakes! Your participation points are not based on how grammatically correct you are, but if you make a sincere effort to learn and practice. Do not be afraid to volunteer or ask questions either, since most likely others have similar questions. Moreover, as a general rule, university courses require 1-2 hours of study per hour of class instruction. To gain the maximum benefit from this class, please come fully prepared. If you have to miss class, you are also responsible to be fully prepared by the next class meeting.
