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Course Description and General Outline:

Discussion of the components of the Juvenile System, the processing of the juvenile through the Criminal Justice System, the rights of the juvenile, criminological theories relevant to juvenile delinquency and criminal behavior will be explored. Students will be required to relate theoretical subject matter with current events.

Attendance:

Attendance comprises of one-third of the final class grade (refer to grading policy). Upon three absences a deficiency notice will be sent to the registrar with the recommendation that the student withdraw from the class. Students who miss three or more classes will receive a grade of "FA-Failure due to poor attendance." On rare occasions, exceptions will be made due to documented military necessity and/ or serious family / or personal reasons. Grading Policy:

Grades will be based on a point system.
