Course Description

This course serves as an introduction to western art music from the Baroque to the 20th century. Emphasis will be on how music is shaped by culture and how culture is shaped by music. No prior experience is necessary.

- To sharpen awareness as an active listener and concert goer and become an active participant in musical styles that are unfamiliar.
