### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course provides an introduction to the world of business and organizations and examines the functions and relationships of marketing, human resources, accounting, information systems and law. The class is **team-taught** by faculty from various business disciplines. Your faculty team will use a variety of methods to help you learn about business, including a computer simulation on running your **own** business, workshops on career planning, resume-writing exercises and internet exercises as the **more-traditional textbook and case** approach. Business community leaders serve as resource persons.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

The main objectives of this course are to:

- 1. Provide the student with a basic understanding of managerial concepts and procedures.
- 2. Provide a background for more informed decision making.
- 3. Prepare the student for further study in the field of management.

### MIDTERM AND FINAL EXAMINATIONS (18% EACH)

The midterm and final examinations will focus on the material covered in the textbook. The format will be mainly objective, with some short essays and descriptions.

### THRESHOLD MANAGEMENT SIMULATION GROUP PROJECT (20%)

Students will form teams of five or six members each to compete in an **online** management simulation called *Threshold Competitor*. The simulation **will** allow you to apply concepts that you have learned as you manage your own simulated small manufacturing company. Teams will make a number of managerial decisions for their company for each period of operation of the simulation. Each period represents one quarter (i.e., three months) of a calendar year. You will manage your company for over a year of simulated operation (five *Threshold* quarters).

There will be five group written reports (each worth 4 points) due during the semester, based on the ongoing simulation. Each team member will be responsible for writing one of those **reports**, based on input from his/her team. The task of writing the report involves coordinating meetings with the group, gathering input, and putting the ideas **expressed** by your group into a write up of three-to-five pages. The report-writer will be in charge of presenting the group's findings to the class in an oral presentation of about 5 minutes. There is a late penalty of 1 point per day for late submissions. For groups of **six** members, the remaining group member will be responsible for writing and submitting one of the group Internet exercises.

The due dates for these five written reports are as follows:

The group is ultimately responsible if the team member in charge fails to submit a report or submits one of poor quality. All will get a zero or a late penalty for the assignment if the student in charge does not submit the report as expected.

### **GROUP PRESENTATION (10%)**

Over the course of the semester, teams will be assigned to make presentations on the Internet exercises posted on the Web site of our textbook.

Each team will be assigned two Internet assignments, and will be allocated about 15 minutes to make each presentation. Each assignment requires you to respond to specific questions. Your presentation will present your answers to these questions. You do not need to submit the written answers to these questions UNLESS you are in a group of six members. Five members will write up Threshhold reports, and the sixth will be responsible for leading the research for one of the Internet exercises and submitting a written report with the team's findings.

Go to the bottom of the home page, and click on the chapter that you want, for example, Chapter 1. After you've made the link, you will see a menu bar on the left side of the page. Click on Internet resources, and see the Internet exercises for each chapter. **Click** on your team's assigned exercise and follow the directions.

#### A WORD ON GROUP DYNAMICS

During the first week of class, you will form teams of five or six students each. You will work with these teams for the rest of the semester for all the group and team assignments. You will be asked to evaluate each member of your team at the end of the course. (See sample evaluation sheet at the end of this syllabus.)

#### **Peer Evaluation**

Your group will evaluate your participation in group dynamics, and this will affect your final grade in the course. At the end of the semester, Peer Group Evaluation forms will be distributed to each team member (a copy is attached at the end of the **syllabus**). Your individual grade will be a weighted number reflecting your straight group grade, weighted by your Individual contribution, as determined by your peers.

#### **Dysfunctional Groups**

If a group is having trouble with a member who fails to attend group meetings, fails to do his/her share of the work or otherwise disrupts the group process, then the group is empowered to **"fire"** that member. A member who has been "fired" from a group must either join another group (if one will "hire" him/her) or else must do all the remaining group work as a team-of-one.

### INDIVIDUAL ASSIGNMENTS AND PRESENTATION (30%)

One of the three parts of the mission of Chaminade University is "to prepare its students for professional careers...." To further this objective students in this class will be given an opportunity to explore career activities. This **exploration** will happen in one of two ways. The first way will be through career workshops that will be presented throughout the semester. The schedule for these workshops will be distributed later. If you can not attend the required number of sessions you will need to complete a 20-page essay. This essay will be on a mutually agreed upon topic of interest that relates to personal and professional development in the area of business that you are most interested in. This paper will need to be in proper form (see your catalog for details) and will be due at the end of the semester

You will need to submit one written report of about three pages on these workshops. The form for this paper will be distributed one month before the paper is due. All students will also be required to submit a resume. You may receive assistance with the resume from Nancy Oide **in** the Career Services Office. You may also want to start a career file in the career services office during this semester. The resumes will be due by the end of the semester. Everyone will be required to submit a rough draft and a final version of their **resume**.

#### **CHAPTER QUIZZES (14%)**

There will be a **quiz** given for each of the fourteen chapters that we will cover during the semester. Each quiz will count for **1%** of your course grade. Make ups will only be given upon a showing of good cause (e.g. doctors notice). The instructors reserve the right to determine whether any make ups will be allowed.

If there is any student in this class who has need for special accommodations, please feel free to come and discuss\_this\_with your instructors.

#### HOW TO SUCCEED IN THIS COURSE

The major goal of BU 200 is to teach you the basic **principles** of business; however, the course has an important secondary goal, which is to develop and refine the key skills that you will need to be successful in business. These include skills in analysis, in oral and written communication and in presentation techniques, as well as the abilities to work **well** in teams and to use information technology with ease. Because these skills are so vital for success, your BU 200 assignments are geared **specifically** towards improving these **skills**.

#### ATTENDANCE AND PARTICIPATION

Much of your learning will take place in the classroom through discussions, roleplaying and simulations. Attendance is important and you will lose **one-half** of a point for each unexcused absence. The instructors reserve the right to issue a grade of "F" or to otherwise adjust the grade of any student who misses more than 20% of the scheduled class sessions.
