Course title: Agency Administration

Course description:

Critical analysis of federal administrative organizations as an integral part of the political system. Roles of Congress, the President, the courts, interest groups, political parties and the administrative process; special attention to centripetal and centrifugal forces. This course is required for PubAd and JusAd majors and should be taken early in the program. This course also examines the development of public and private administration. Some of the major concepts covered include: theories of administrative organization; principles and methods of administrative management; executive leadership; interpersonal and intergroup relationships; levels of decision-making; planning; evaluation strategies; ethics

and responsibilities.
